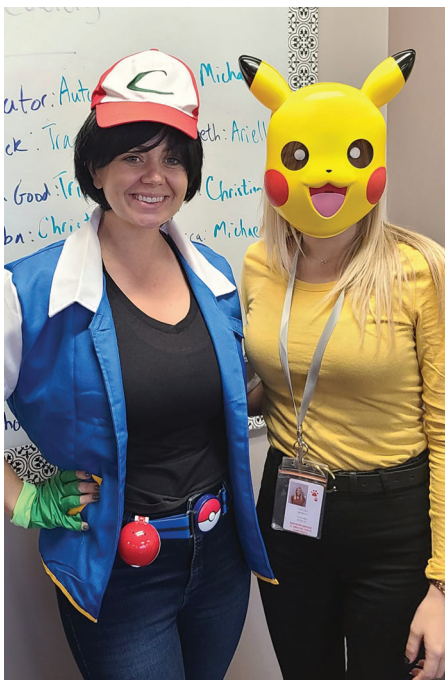

Student Progress

Report cards

Report cards are issued for each student in each school four times a year at the end of each marking period.

Parent-teacher conferences

Parent-teacher conferences are designed to communicate a student's educational program and progress to parents. Attendance is encouraged. It is expected that parents and teachers will confer at other times during the year. If a problem/concern arises, parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher or guidance counselor. It is necessary to make an appointment for a conference.

Getting the most out of parent-teacher conferences

Parent-teacher conferences are a good time to learn about your child's academic achievement. The following tips, adapted from the National Education Association, will help you make the most of parent teacher conferences.

Getting ready

Talk to your children before the conference. Find out which subjects they like best, those they like least, and why. Also, ask your children if there is anything they want you to talk about with their teachers.

The conference

Some questions for your child's teacher:

- *Does my child get along well with others?*
- *What are my child's strongest subjects?*
- *What areas need improvement?*
- *Is my child working up to his or her ability?*
- *Does my child participate in class discussions and activities?*
- *How does my child handle taking tests?*
- *Has my child missed any classes or work other than what I have already been contacted about?*
- *Have there been any recent behavior changes?*

Ask for specific suggestions on how to help your child improve. Have the teacher explain any answers you don't understand. It's a good idea to end the conference by summing up decisions you've made together. If needed, ask to meet again.



Keeping in contact

Observe your child's behavior and check your child's class work and homework. Keep in touch with teachers to discuss progress. Building a strong parent-teacher partnership is necessary if you and your child's teachers are to reach a common goal of helping your child get the best education possible.

How to reach your child's teachers

Most staff may be contacted through their school email account. Email addresses consist of the first and last name of the staff member separated by a period and followed by the domain @oesj.org. For example, John Smith would be john.smith@oesj.org. Contact information for teachers, administrators and district level staff can be found on the district's website, www.oesj.org.

Contact the main office of each building if you need help contacting a staff member.

Annual Professional Performance Review (APPR) Notification

All parents/guardians have the right to obtain the Annual Professional Performance Review (APPR) quality ratings and composite effectiveness scores for their child's teacher(s) and principal(s) once the scores are officially available in accordance with state law.

School closings and delays

The Superintendent of Schools may close the schools or dismiss students/staff early in the event of severe weather or hazardous road conditions. Every attempt will be made to ensure that younger students will not be

left without proper parental supervision.

The school district uses the Parent Square system to directly notify families of school closings and other emergencies.

If no report is heard, it can be assumed the schools are opening on time.

Unless otherwise stated, all announced closings and delays will be district-wide for both OESJ school buildings.

Deciding whether or not to close or delay school is always a difficult decision, and district officials understand that a decision to open or close in bad weather will have a major impact on our families. While the district recognizes that students are best served academically by being in school, the safety of our students is always our top priority.

OESJ Board of Education

The OESJ Central School District Board of Education regularly meets on the first Wednesday of the month. Meeting locations, unless otherwise advised, alternate between the OESJ JR/SR High School auditorium and the OESJ Elementary School cafeteria. All meetings, including special meetings, will be held in the OESJ JR/SR High Auditorium during the months of August, October, December, February, April, and June; and in September, November, January, March, and May they will be held in the OESJ Elementary School Cafeteria.

Board Meeting Agendas

The district posts Board of Education meeting agendas and other available documents, in compliance with the state Open Meetings Law, as early as possible prior to meetings. Agendas can be found on BoardDocs through the district website and are distributed in paper form at all meetings.

Addressing the Board

Anyone who wishes to address the Board of Education can do so during the "public comment" portion of the meeting. Meetings begin at 6 p.m. unless otherwise noted. Regular meetings are listed in this calendar. Additional meetings are scheduled as needed and will be posted on the district website and distributed to local media. Meetings are open to the public.

Public Comment

The board provides a public comment session at most of its meetings, and allows the audience an opportunity to ask questions about agenda items or about programs or operations within the school. Comments or questions on personnel matters will not be addressed in public sessions. Comments are recorded in the meeting minutes and posted on BoardDocs. When the board officially approves the minutes for previous meetings, they become official. The board asks that comments be kept brief and to the point. If you would like to address the Board of Education, please do so in a courteous and thoughtful manner. Please refrain from interrupting and commenting on issues until it is your turn to speak.

The Oppenheim-Ephratah-St. Johnsville Central School District will not tolerate bullying of any kind, and is prepared to meet the requirements of New York's Dignity for All Students Act, which took effect on July 1, 2012.

Schools cannot address bullying unless incidents are reported, which is why the district encourages staff, students and parents to speak up when they witness bullying. As our children grow, mature and learn to understand the impact of their words and actions on others, they need to receive a consistent message that certain words and behaviors are not acceptable.

Anyone who feels that he or she has been bullied, who wants to report an incident of someone else being bullied or who has questions about bullying should contact the appropriate building Dignity Act coordinator. (See box at top right.)

Dignity for All Students

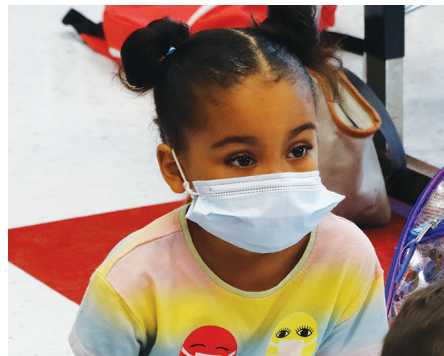
What is bullying?

Definition: Bullying is a conscious, willful, deliberate activity intended to harm in which the bully uses power through actions or intimidation to cause pain and/or misery. It can be verbal, physical, electronic and/or relational.

Bullying can include as its focus, but is not limited to a person's actual or perceived:

- Physical attributes
- Religion
- Race
- Sexual orientation
- Ethnicity
- Mental disability
- Weight
- Socioeconomic status
- Other differences, real or perceived

Bullying includes all forms of hazing and cyberbullying. It can be and often is continuous and repeated over time, but does not have to be. Once is enough to constitute bullying.

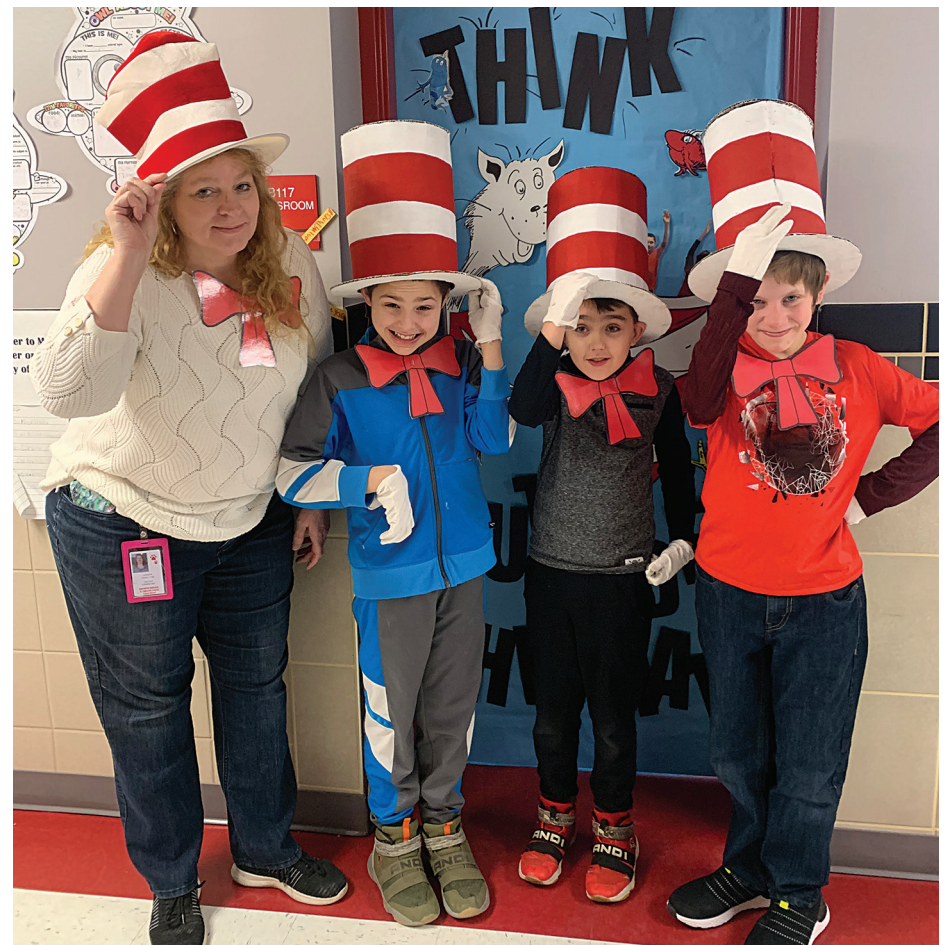

MySchoolBucks

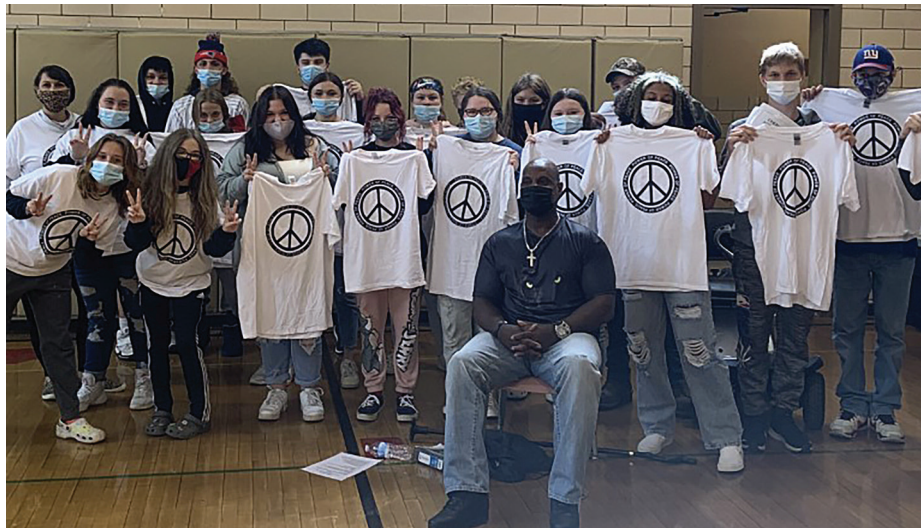
Parents can create a secure account in MySchoolBucks to pay for their child's additional purchases in the cafeteria. You will need a credit card and email address. The account will also allow you to track your child's purchases and will alert you when the balance becomes low.

Student Conduct in the Cafeteria/Lunchroom

To make lunchtime more enjoyable for everyone, the cafeteria/lunchroom staff asks that all students:

- Respect the monitor/teacher.
- Walk in single file.
- Talk in quiet, conversational voice.
- Follow posted classroom and lunchtime rules.
- No pushing, running or throwing food.
- No glass containers.
- Keep uneaten food on trays and empty trays carefully.
- Remain seated until dismissed by the monitor/teacher.

Students who misbehave during lunchtime will be reminded of the rules after their first offense. Students who continue to misbehave will be disciplined under the district's Code of Conduct.



Directory Information/Photo Policy

From time to time, student directory information (name, grade, awards, activities, photograph, etc.) may be published on the district's website, social media, in school publications or released to the media to recognize student achievement or depict activities of the school. Required Notifications

Parental notice of Body Mass Index (BMI) reporting

New York state requires schools to track each student's body mass index (BMI) and weight status category as part of school health examinations. Every year, the New York State Department of Health surveys some schools for the number of students in each weight status category. If OESJ Elementary School or Jr/Sr High School is surveyed by the state, the district will share summary group data only and will not share summary group calculations. To opt out of the sharing of this data, parents must contact your child's school nurse by Dec. 1.

Pesticide application notification

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and non public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation to students, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The Oppenheim-Ephratah-St. Johnsville Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation to students, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notice of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification: when school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application; anti-microbial products; non-volatile rodenticides or insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children; silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams or gels in areas inaccessible to children; boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;

the application of EPA designated biopesticides; the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25; and the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging or biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets. In the event an emergency application is necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good-faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, please notify the OESJ Facilities Director Jeffrey Swartz, (518) 568-2011 ext. 3180.
